

**Crowmarsh Gifford Church of England Primary
Pupil Premium**



The Pupil Premium was introduced in April 2011. It is allocated to children from low-income families who are known to be eligible for free school meals and children who have been look after continuously for more than six months. Eligibility for the Pupil Premium for 2012-13 was extended to pupils who have been eligible for free school meals at any point in the last six years (known as the Ever6 Free School Meals measure). Schools also receive funding for children who have been looked after continuously for more than six months. (Taken From www.ofsted.gov.uk – The Pupil Premium)

We also receive a Service Premium which is a smaller amount of money allocated for children of service personnel. Every school is legally required to report on their spending of this money and the impact that it has on the specified pupils.

Raising Achievement

Action	Amount Spent	Evaluation of Impact
Small Group Work with Teachers for Maths and Literacy	£10354	Lessons have become more tailored to children's learning and personalised to help children achieve their best.
New Tracking System	£500	All groups of pupils are now easily identified and can see progress clearly.
Be the Best You Can Be Programme	£2000	Olympic Legacy Programme – Focused on All Groups of Children Achieving the 'Best They Can Be' in all that they do. Children go through individual targets and lessons delivered through PSHCE.

Pastoral Care

Action	Amount Spent	Evaluation of Impact
RAFters - RAF club	£300	Children have a chance to get together to have fun once a week. If any issues arise they are then taken to Home-Link Worker.
Home Link Worker – In school two half days.	£3000	She works with families and their children. They have a chance to talk to someone with follow-up on a regular basis. Group-Work, Counselling, Talking/Drawing therapy.
SENCO training and support	£1000	Inclusion Manager fully established in school to work with all groups of pupils.
Drop-Ins – lunchtime club run by TA and SENCO	£1386	Children able to come to a ‘drop-in’ session during lunchtimes to discuss any issues.
1:1 TA Behaviour Support	£1900	Children who struggle with behaviour are given 1:1 support throughout the day in lessons and on the playground.
Training	£859	Staff have been trained in various therapy programmes such as ‘drawing therapy’ and ‘star group.’ We now have member of staff qualified to run these groups when needed. Outdoor training has begun to begin our focus on learning in the outdoors.

Increasing Participation/Improving Access

Action	Amount Spent	Evaluation of Impact
Uniform	£30	Children are all able to feel a part of the school and not any different to everyone else.
Club/Extra-Curricular Activities	£200	Children can attend out of school or in-school events to help maintain routine and focus on things that they enjoy.
School Field Trips	£200	All children are able to attend school outings no matter what their circumstances.
