Choose your homework from the menu below:

Choose three objects from around your house. Write a story about the objects.

Collaborate with others at home to build a model. Take photographs/bring in your model and talk about how you built your model.

Write a poem. It could be a space poem. Memorise it and perform it to your class.

Make up a song about space. Perform it to your class.

Challenge: When biscuits are shared between two people there is always 1 left over. How many space biscuits could there be? Find a way to record your ideas.

Create your own planet, record your ideas about your planet.

Find out something you did not know about space.

Go on a 3d shape hunt. Bring in your shapes and talk about the shapes you found and the number of faces/edges they have.
