Create a quiz including 10 maths questions AND 10 English questions from our topics this week.




Crazy Crosswords

Convince Us

Is there something you would like to convince us of? Something you would like to change at school? Something that we should be doing to help our local community? Something you have heard about in the news recently? Put your best debating skills to work and write a persuasive letter about your chosen topic. Remember 5 paragraphs!



Learn spellings



- Look, say, cover, write, check
 - Ask someone to test you
 - Is there a spelling rule that helps?
 - Identify the tricky part & a way to remember it
- Don't forget to make sure you know what all the words mean!*



Lesson Planner

Plan a short (10 minute) revision lesson for the class (you will have to deliver it as well!) based on key learning points you have taken from class. Think about questions you could ask and tasks you could get the class to complete to assess their understanding.



Read all about it

Read a newspaper article and bring it in to share with the class– what would you like to discuss about the article? Make some notes and questions you could ask. Alternatively, write a newspaper article of your own (real or imagined) event.
