<p>Be a high frequency word (HFW) detective!</p> <p>Find your favourite books and find as many HFW words as you can. to, the, no, I, go, in, on, at, is, it, and, into, we, she, he, me.</p>	<p>Talk about numbers and how they are related to each other on number line.</p> <p>Find a number that is larger, bigger, greater, fewer, smaller, more, less. Can you think of a number that is after?/before?/ in between?</p>	<p>Go on a shape hunt.</p> <p>Find different 2d shapes around your house. How do you know it is a square/rectangle/ triangle/ circle/ pentagon/ hexagon or octagon? How do you know it is not a ...?</p>
<p>Play a turn taking game</p> <p>Find a game you enjoy playing (snap, pairs, lotto, dominoes)</p>	<p>Do some baking/ cooking.</p> <p>You could bake something really or imaginary, inside or outside, the possibilities are endless!</p>	<p>Create an animal habitat</p> <p>Use junk/ construction. Design and create a habitat (home) for an animal. What makes it a good habitat?</p>
<p>Draw your favourite animal and then find out something about the animal you did not know.</p> <p>Can you label it? What letter does the animal name start with?</p>	<p>Make a den with your family.</p> <p>Discuss and share design ideas with your family about how to make a den. Talk to each other and share jobs to create the den.</p>	<p>Create a book about animals.</p> <p>It can be any type of book you like. Information book, rhyming books, animal alliteration book.</p> <p>What sounds can you hear at the beginning of words? Use your letter flashcards to help you with what the letters look like if you find it tricky.</p>
<p>Collect and/or explore objects that interest you.</p> <p>What interesting objects can you find in your garden/ around your house? Ask questions about what they are and maybe what they are used for?</p>	<p>Read rhymes/ Make up silly rhymes/ Sing nursery rhymes.</p> <p>Talk about the rhyming words. You could try and write down some of the words that rhyme.</p>	<p>Create a ball game</p> <p>Use an outside space if you have one. Make up a ball game. Do you need to keep a score? How will you do this? Use chalk/ clip board?</p>
